However, systematic evidence on outcomes for looked-after children beyond the early adult years is limited. In this session Amanda Sacker and Emily Murray, authors of Children Grown Up study, explain how they explored the long-term consequences of being cared for in institutional or family settings using data from the Office of National Statistics Longitudinal Study (ONS LS) and their findings.

They will also describe the partnership work in progress which is impacting Looked After Children and Care Leavers access to dental care.
	1:00-1:30pm	The looked after children and care leavers primary care project.	<a href="#">NHS: Dr Sharon Kefford, GP children's safeguarding and designated doctor for looked after children Surrey Countywide.</a> Over the past 12-18 months Dr Kefford has been working in partnership with her counterpart Dr Tamsin Robinson in Ealing. Also a GP, named GP and designated doctor for looked after children. They have produced professional guidance tools for GPs and GP practices highlighting their roles and responsibilities with regards to looked after children and care leavers. The project was a joint venture between health and social care professionals in Surrey and Ealing. Two short practical guidance videos were produced by the Primary Care Safeguarding Forum for GPs, in collaboration with care experienced young people in Surrey and foster carers in Ealing. The first video provides practical guidance related to providing primary care services for looked after children and the second for care leavers.
