Remember, balance and engagement are key; distributing content evenly and encouraging viewer engagement through visuals and concise text will enhance the overall effectiveness of your presentation.

### Appearance

#### **Clarity:**

- **Tip:** Ensure that your poster is clear and easy to read from a distance. Use legible fonts e.g. Arial and avoid overcrowding with information.
- **Why it matters:** Clarity enhances the viewer's understanding of your innovation and makes it more accessible.

#### **Font Size:**

- **Tip:** Use a readable font size for all text. 32pt is easily readable up to 6 feet away on an average size 36" x 48" poster. We suggest using between 28pt and 40pt for best viewing. Ensure headings and subheadings are appropriately sized for increased emphasis.
- **Why it matters:** Legible text is essential for effective communication, allowing viewers to grasp key information quickly.

#### **Visual Appeal:**

- **Tip:** Incorporate graphics, charts and images to enhance the visual appeal of your poster.
- **Why it matters:** A visually engaging poster is more likely to attract and hold the viewer's interest and convey information effectively.

### Colour Scheme:

- **Tip:** Choose a cohesive colour scheme that complements your content. Use colours purposefully to highlight key points.
- **Why it matters:** A well-thought-out colour scheme enhances visual appeal and reinforces the poster's overall design.

### Content

#### Headings and Subheadings:

- **Tip:** Clearly label sections with headings and subheadings, see suggestions on the template provided. Use them to guide the viewer through your poster and highlight key information.
- **Why it matters:** Headings and subheadings provide structure and help viewers quickly locate and understand the content within each section. Here are some suggestions, and what you may like to present under each:
  - **Abstract** – summarise your innovation in practice, its uniqueness, intended impact on health outcomes, and how it addresses health inequalities
  - **Introduction** - Briefly introduce the context and need for the innovation. Clearly state the goals and objectives of the service development.
  - **Innovation in practice** - Describe the uniqueness and originality of the idea.
    - Leadership: Provide evidence of the initiative being school nurse-led.
    - Partnership: Showcase the importance of collaboration with partners for sustainable changes.
  - **High Impact Areas** - Highlight the specific high-impact areas the innovation focuses on (e.g., mental health, immunisation, sexual health, etc.).
  - **Successful practice** - Explain the innovative aspects of the idea. Emphasise the use of evidence to inform the development of the innovation.
    - Value: Demonstrate the intended impact on health outcomes and reducing health inequalities.
    - Measurable: Describe the evaluation methodology for assessing the initiative's impact.
    - Transferable: Discuss how the ideas can be shared or adapted for use in other school nursing services.
  - **Results and Evaluation** –
    - Outcomes: Present what are or will be the measurable outcomes and improvements you have, or you hope to achieve.
    - Lessons Learned: Discuss any challenges faced or you predict, and lessons learned during the planning or implementation.
  - **Conclusions** - Summarise the key points of the innovation.
    - Future Directions: Suggest potential future developments or expansions.

**Consistency:**

- **Tip:** Maintain a consistent and organised layout throughout your poster. Organise content logically, with a clear flow from one section to another.
- **Why it matters:** Consistency promotes a professional appearance and helps viewers navigate your poster easily.

**Balance:**

- **Tip:** Distribute text and visuals evenly for a balanced composition. Avoid overcrowding one area while leaving another empty.
- **Why it matters:** Balanced layouts contribute to a harmonious and professional appearance, preventing visual overload.

**Engagement:**

- **Tip:** Encourage viewer engagement through thought-provoking visuals and concise text. Use bullet points and short sentences to convey information efficiently.
- **Why it matters:** Engaged viewers are more likely to remember and appreciate the details of your innovation.
